The hospital has performed 184 free cataract surgeries and served 1,993 outpatients. Additionally, medical camps have been conducted in 29 different locations and villages, extending healthcare access to those in need.</p> <p>The hospital also operates a dental care unit, catering to 25-30 patients daily, ensuring that dental health is prioritized within the community. Furthermore, an ambulance service is available for poor patients, facilitating transport to and from the hospital.</p> <p>For patients undergoing cataract surgery, the hospital provides support with travel and food</p>

					arrangements, ensuring that they receive the necessary care without added financial burden. These initiatives collectively enhance the quality of life for individuals in the tribal area, promoting better health outcomes and access to essential medical services.

Over the course of three batches, a total of 57 women successfully completed the training. This initiative provided valuable skills to empower participants, potentially enhancing their economic opportunities and contributing to community development.</p> <p>At the Ethne Training Center, several improvements were made, including sanitation repairs, the construction of two new guest rooms, repairs to two existing guest rooms, and the building of steps. Additionally, the grounds were cleared, landscaping was completed, and other necessary repairs were carried out to enhance the facility. These upgrades aim to improve the center's infrastructure and overall functionality.</p>

Financial support was extended to boost productivity, modernize farming practices.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · To increase agricultural productivity of cashew, turmeric, brooms, pineapple, and other crops.

4	2023-24	Arise & Shine	Srikakulam Pedda kongaram village	Free tailoring classes	In this project, free sewing lessons were provided to women, empowering them with practical skills to support their families and enhance their livelihoods. The initiative aimed to offer life education that could make a lasting impact on their daily lives. The training center, located in the leprosy colony in Srikakulam near urban and slum areas, successfully trained three batches of 20 people each. Through this program, women gained valuable skills that could contribute to their economic and social well-being. Through this project 65 members benefited in slum area. 25 members benefited in villages.

This consistent medical attention is crucial for their treatment and recovery, helping to manage the disease and improve their quality of life.</p> <p>Educational support is provided to the children of individuals affected by leprosy to help them pursue higher education. This initiative aims to offer these children better opportunities for academic and personal growth, breaking the cycle of poverty and illness, and empowering them to build a brighter future. 22 children benefited.</p>

					<p>Nutrition support is provided to people infected and affected by leprosy. Based on their individual health needs, a gathering was arranged where nutrition packets were distributed, and meals were served to their families. This initiative aims to improve their overall health and well-being, ensuring that both patients and their families receive adequate nutrition during their treatment and recovery.</p> <p>Financial support has been provided to a blind man's family living in the leprosy colony to help meet their food needs. This assistance is essential, as it allows them to avoid going out for begging or work, ensuring they have access to adequate nutrition while maintaining their dignity. The initiative aims to improve their overall well-being and provide a sense of security for the family.</p>

Nursing, Intermediate, MCA, and ECE (Electronics and Communication Engineering) programs.</p> <p>Educational support was provided to students from tribal families who were unable to pay their education fees. As a result, a total of 10 younger and older children are continuing their education. Among them are school students, as well as girls pursuing B.Sc. Nursing and Pharmacy courses.</p> <p>Medical Assistance Provided to Poor Patients for Cancer and Fibroid Treatment</p> <p>A tribal woman was provided hospital support for</p>

These families, facing extreme poverty, were in dire need of stable and secure housing.
